Does it matter if the wine is red or white?

The symbolic element of the wine, however, is not to be confused with the real presence of Christ in the sacrament. While the wine retains its external properties, its **essence is transformed**. What is essential is not the color of the wine, but the reality of Christ that becomes present through it.

Did you know:

- You can make Bellarmine Chapel a beneficiary on your IRA or 401k account, which may reduce estate taxes.
- For those at least 70 and ½, you can make a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) from your IRA. You can also use the QCD to comply with your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD), which begins at age 73.
