Do we use gluten-free hosts?

No, we use low-gluten hosts, not gluten-free ones, as the Eucharist must be made from wheat bread. Our hosts are approved by the USCCB and contain such a low amount of gluten that someone with Celiac Sprue Disease would need to consume 270 wafers at once to trigger a reaction! If you need a low-gluten host, ask a sacristan before Mass.

PATHFINDERS TO 30: Harry Burwinkel

Hank Burwinkel was the individual most responsible for Bellarmine's engagement with the Shalom coalition and Habitat for Humanity. This took place through his association with a friend at Hyde Park Community United

Methodist Church, one of the founding congregations of the coalition. Bellarmine joined in 2000, when the coalition's third and fourth houses were being constructed. Hank worked on Shalom's construction sites well into his 80's, even despite pleas from his family members to slow down and also despite the onset of Parkinson's disease. Hank served as the Co-Leader of no less than seven of the Shalom projects and did so informally for many others.

Hank was well suited for this role, as in previous years, he had owned a contracting company and had also served as the Building Commissioner for several local municipalities. Maryann, Hank's wife, took part alongside Hank as the liaison between Cincinnati Habitat and the families who became owners of Shalom's houses, helping them to fulfill their in-kind contribution requirements and to make selections regarding styles and colors within the house. For 15 years, Hank and Maryann, together with their poodle Teddie, provided companionship and therapy for those at Hospice of Cincinnati in Blue Ash. According to Hank's daughter Edie, Habitat was a major part of Hank's life following his retirement. For his service, Hank received awards from the Governor of Ohio and from Millard Fuller, the founder of Habitat for Humanity International. Hank and Maryann twice made trips to Plains, GA, to take in services and Sunday school with Jimmy Carter.
