The Church uses precise words to clearly express faith, even if they seem complex. Some terms, like "consubstantial," ensure accuracy where simpler phrases might be vague. Since we're articulating profound mysteries like the Trinity, it makes sense to use language that captures their full meaning as precisely as possible.

- Daily Masses: 87 average live stream views (about 3% decrease vs. last month).
- 6 children received the Sacrament of Baptism.
- 110 children participated in Children's Liturgy of the Word.

Parish Life Ministry and Adult Faith Formation

- 23 parish staff members from Bellarmine and St. Xavier attended a retreat.
- 3 Masses of Christian Burial were celebrated.
- 13 new households (27 individuals) registered this month.

Children's Faith Formation

- 20 children participated in Drop in and Play.
- 27 children attended childcare.

Youth Ministry

- 18 teens participated in a retreat to prepare for Confirmation.
- 12 teens and Youth Ministry interns went skiing at Perfect North.
- 20 teens participated in Confirmation session with Fr. Paul.

Social Mission and Sustainability Ministries

- \$11,919 was collected for all outreach collections.
- Approximately 2,000 diapers and 30 packages of wipes were collected for Sweet Cheeks Diaper Bank.
- 15 people attended the People of All Abilities Screening of Wonder
- 57 people attended the Embracing God's Creation series' Loving Creation prayer service.
- Many parishioners have supported the family of refugees we are hosting through donations and volunteering.
- 10 people attended the Archdiocese's Love in Action workshop.
- 2 vehicles were blessed for Drive to Thrive recipients.
- 60+ home visits were made by our Vincentian volunteers.
