

Last week, two of our members were in the Ohio Statehouse advocating for continuing Medicaid expansion, the abolition of the death penalty, and the expansion of the Ohio Child Tax Credit.

Have priests always practiced celibacy?

No, priests could marry until the 11th century, though most bishops remained celibate. The Church adopted clerical celibacy largely because the laity preferred monastic priests, who took vows of chastity. Their example inspired a desire for priests fully devoted to ministry, living more like Jesus and His apostles.
