

FAITH FORMATION

"Everything is Connected: Laudato Si, Teilhard de Chardin, and Catholic Social Teaching."

It is fortuitous that on April 28, Georgetown University will be holding a previously scheduled seminar, connecting Pope Francis's famous encyclical on the environment, *Laudato Si*, and the life and thought of Pierre Teilhard de Chardin. This year is the 10th anniversary of the encyclical, and the 70th anniversary of Teilhard's death. Sponsored by Georgetown's Initiative on Catholic Social Thought and Public Life, this seminar will include The Teilhard Project's Frank Frost, and a leading expert in Teilhard's thought; Sr. Ilia Delio, OSF; as well as Sr. Libby Osgood, CND; and Diana Marin. The dialogue will be moderated by the Initiative's Director, Kim Daniels.
