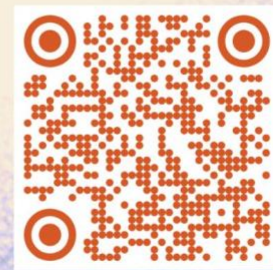

Book Selection for Lent

As we anticipate the prayerful season of Lent, also known as *Purification and Enlightenment* in the OCIA process, it has been our practice each year to offer a book that our parish community can reflect on together over the sacred six weeks.

This year, we are inspired to focus on the phrase of our Jesuit Parish Family Vision Statement, "to bear hope and healing." It is the theme of our Parish Family Retreat on February 6-7, and there will be much "unpacking" of its meaning for us over the next few years.

The selected book is *Epiphanies: Meditations with Scripture* composed by The Sisters of Life. It's a collection of Gospels, including beautiful art, describing intimate encounters between Jesus and those who come to him seeking healing.

Rather than being a book *about* healing, the stories will personally draw us into an experience of receiving the healing touch of Jesus in a way that each of us desires.

This will be an opportunity to be in *solidarity* as we seek, individually and as the Body of Christ, to both receive for ourselves, and to bear hope and healing for others.
